Student Leadership duties around school:

Our rationale in having students on duty across the school ensures that students at all ages and stages of development are actively aware of the standards of behaviour required during break and lunchtime, as well as expected routines, such as following the one-way system in the Maths and Volumetric Blocks and picking up litter to maintain a clean and welcoming environment.

Year 7:

All Year 7 students are required to participate in Environmental Litter Duties. These are on a rota and checked daily by the AHT Student Support: Community.

Student Council Representatives:

Student Council Representatives meet once per half term, towards the end of each half term. During these meetings, students are able to raise any pertinent issues regarding school or community which they feel are important to develop. The meetings are overseen by AHT Student Support: Community.

Year 10 and 11:

Senior Prefects in Year 11 all required to complete either a break or a lunch duty per week. This may involve either supporting required behaviours and alerting staff to where support is required on site, running activities for lower year groups on wet lunch days, or in supporting that the one-way system is followed in the Volumetric and Maths

Block at the end of the break and lunch period. Whilst on duty, Prefects are expected to wear a lanyard, which identifies them as a Prefect and ready to assist students or teachers who may require their support.

Regular half termly meetings are scheduled with the AHT KS4. During this time, adapted rotas are shared, training is updated and expectations are revisited. Prefects are also encouraged to arrive at these meetings with questions and ideas to further develop our Student Leadership Teams.

Prefect duties are monitored by the 6th Form Senior Student Leaders (SSL). The 6th SSL confirm that the duties are taking place, are carried out in the expected way, and feedback any concerns to the AHT KS4.

All prefects participating in break and lunch duties receive training from the AHT KS 4 and DHT Student Support regarding keeping themselves safe whilst being on duty. The 6th SSL team report to the AHT KS 4 and KS 5 regarding QA of duties, but also feed back to the DHT during their scheduled meetings.

Senior Student Leaders:

6th Form:

Towards the end of Year 12, students have the opportunity to apply for **Head Boy** or **Head Girl**, and **Deputy Head Boy** and **Deputy Head Girl**. Once appointed, the primary roles of these students are to:

- Deliver speeches at a variety of school events and functions and to represent the school in the community, when required.
- Meet frequently with the Headteacher and Deputy Headteacher, as well as the Head of Sixth Form, regarding their roles in overseeing student leadership across the school and representation of the school.
- Attend staff mini INSET where relevant and to feed back to staff regarding student voice.

Heads of Houses are also appointed, and work alongside the **Deputy Heads of Houses** in Years 10 and 11 to present regular assemblies and lead on house events across the school.

The Student Wellbeing Committee:

This committee meets once per month, and is overseen by the DHT Student Support. The meetings are chaired by the two 6th Form Student Leaders, who are also trained St John's Ambulance Mental Health First Aiders. They work strategically with KS 4 prefects, but also oversee Student Wellbeing Committee Leaders from Years 8 – 11. This is a new initiative for September 2019, and clear systems will be established at the start of the academic year when.

The Student Environmental Committee:

This committee meets once per month, and is overseen by the AHT Student Support: Community. The meetings are chaired by the two 6th Form Student Leaders, who also lead the 6th Environmental Committee Leaders across the school. The aim of the Environmental Committee is to address wider issues both inside and outside school and to address education of all regarding environmental issues. The two 6th Environmental Committee Leaders also sit on the staff Biodiversity Action Group, run by the Geography Department. The Student Environmental Committee will be instrumental to the school gaining Eco School Status.
